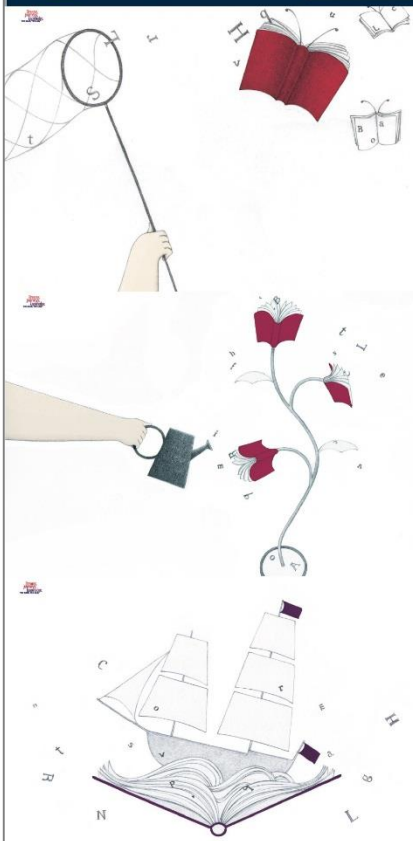


C1V Edizioni

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C1V Publishing was founded 2008 and is a small business entity in the area of Rome that operates as a free publishing company, characterized by a strong vocation that has become fixed: books as a tool for personal, social and ethical growth of culture. Its many non-profit projects are associated with various books: for the series "Once upon a time Kids" we have published "Tartarughe sorprese", a book whose profits support scientific and medical research to fight the rare Lafora disease. The "In the Ward" series has aimed since 2010 at giving away the books included in this series to many children in hospitals, in partnership with the non-profit clown-therapy association "VIP Applauses"; for this reason, it has received the patronage of the Italian Ministry for Arts and Culture. Among publications targeted at teenagers and adults, we publish the book "i dei tanti" by Sauro Bevenuti, a best seller whose profits support the non-profit organization "Niccò City Fans" within the Meyer Foundation of Florence. In 2013 and 2016 the books published by C1V Publishing have supported populations hit by the tornado 'Cleopatra' in Sardinia and by the earthquake in Central Italy. The popular science series "Scientia et Causa", born in 2015 and dedicated to issues of great relevance, promotes the culture of Science, with contributions from experts such as Piero Angela, Giorgio Dobrilla and Armando De Vincentis. From 2015 we have added training and our cinematic debut with the film "Bomba libera tutti!".

 The publishing industry in the Lazio region - where the self-publishing houses (accounting for 17% of the national total) employ more than 1,000 staff and publish around 120,000 titles with around 1 million copies being released onto the market every year - constitutes not only a critical cultural heritage but also a great resource for the regional economy. We are endeavouring to support small and medium-sized publishers with innovative tools, digitized through a programme that encompasses the spheres of both cultural and editorial activities. The Translational Catalogue forms part of this strategy and consists of the quality of an impact assessment that we launched with a view to promoting and raising the global profile of our small and medium publishing sector. More than 100 works (novel, essays, Lazio-based publishing sector) were translated thanks to the support of Lazio Region. In the catalogue, you can then access everything from essays and fiction to reports and cartoons. In all subjects, a wealth of illustrations and videos of the results, spreading the latest news and cultural quality of our region, which are drawing an audience that extends far beyond the regional borders.

 Lazio International is the regional programme intended to support the internationalization of the local manufacturing sector. It is the tool through which we aim to increase the competitiveness of our businesses, encouraging their expansion into new markets and helping them to leverage the major innovative processes currently available in the global value chain. To this end, we have set aside 10 million for the operations scheduled for the period 2014-2020, of which 10 million are available immediately for use on the activities planned for 2014.

It is against this backdrop that we have decided to support the regional publishing industry through a range of international grant awards, reinforcing its structural growth and enhancing its international profile. We are doing so by helping small and medium-sized Lazio-based publishers with the translation of their own work and their participation in international trade fairs, promoting a plethora of associated activities.

Having already supported in 2013 the volume dedicated to "The creative excellence of cartoons and illustrations in Rome and Lazio", the Lazio region International Catalogue enables important information on the international promotion of excellence in publishing. The catalogue collects best cartoons in English of over 100 small work (mostly created by Lazio-based publishers, with some a highlight from beyond Italy's borders). The translations can be downloaded from the www.laziointernational.it site. We are delighted to be able to do this in thanks also to the support of Lazio Region that its publishers have been allowed the opportunity to have translated, free of charge, a number of cartoons of their works to promote personal literary activities or to bring international trade fairs such as the Frankfurt Book Fair.

This is one of the various ways in which we are supporting our local strengths and our knowledge resources. The Lazio International initiative relies on a wealth of other resources that we are making available to SMEs in the region.

 The Frankfurt Book Fair is the largest of all the international book fairs. At the expo, around 3000 authors, editors, publishers, printers, translators, librarians, booksellers, distributors and retailers. The Frankfurt fair is famous for its excellent category of non-fiction: the cultural product - i.e. the fruit of thought and of work - representing the thought, imagination and creation, destined to be enjoyed and explored, to stimulate questions, to risk answers, to describe experiences and to make the most of the new ideas, which in books is contained in order to offer us a reflection on the past and to imagine the future.

For publishers and authors, attending the Buchmesse is a sine qua non. But it is not always possible to do so. In such cases, and the competition is fierce. This year, for the first time, the Region is supporting Lazio-based publishers in their efforts to have a presence there, to participate actively, and to put their best products on the show floor of the main market. The Region is doing so through the new Translational Catalogue.

Each publisher was offered the chance to have a summary and a number of pages of the chosen work(s) translated, and for the translation to appear in this printed catalogue. It is a first step in the positioning of our culture and our tradition on the world market, and towards the overcoming of language barriers, with a view to boosting familiarity with our country and bolstering our competitiveness in book publishing - a sector that is as important as it is delicate.

"In the Wind" series has aimed since its inception to give the books published in the series to many children in hospitals, accompanied with the non-profit "Lazio Energy Association" (TEP Appliance). For this reason, it has received the patronage of the Italian Ministry for Area and Culture. Among publications support of teenagers and adults, we publish the book "A chi non si dà pace" for young filmmakers. A few other projects support the non-profit organization "Natura Care" that makes the "Mare" Foundation of Rome. It is not only the books published by CIVILIZAZIONI that support the young people but also the "Civiltà" magazine, which is published by the organization and by the workshop in Central Italy.

The digital version "Civiltà in Casa" has in 2014 and 2015 been dedicated to books of reference, promoting the culture of Science, with contributions from regions such as Frosinone, Lazio, Emilia-Romagna and Umbria. De Vincenzi, from 2014 we have edited various and new computer show with the "Mare" theme series.

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
